


I am currently living in Sofia, Bulgaria this autumn and winter, and

Joseph and Shannon grew up

in different parts of rural Ontario, meeting for the first time at a vegetarian restaurant in Guelph, one of Canada's main agricultural centres. Not long afterward, Joseph and Shannon were asked to coordinate a commissioned report on the animal welfare, environmental, public health and rural community impacts of industrial animal agriculture in Canada -- the first national report of its kind. They also organized '10 000 Tastes, 10 Billion Reasons', the largest vegan event in Canada's history, which provided more than 12,000 people with free plant-based food samples at Yonge-Dundas Square, Canada's busiest pedestrian intersection.

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
